

Pursuant to the **Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA) of 1993**, Pub. L. No. 103-141, 107 Stat. 1488, codified at 42 U.S.C. § 2000bb through 42 U.S.C. § 2000bb-4, I hereby implement an objection to the federal vaccine mandate. Accordingly, under RFRA, I am claiming a religious exemption due to my religious beliefs and practices. This federal law ensures my religious freedoms are protected under RFRA as well as under the **First Amendment**.

Accordingly, I also hereby invoke the **Fourth Amendment**; specifically, I have a right to be secure in my person, house, papers and effects against any unreasonable search and seizure. Therefore, my Fourth Amendment right shall not be violated due to this religious exemption.

Additionally, under the **Fourteenth Amendment**, “no state shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any State deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.” Therefore, my Fourteenth Amendment right shall not be violated due to this religious exemption.

Finally, pursuant to **Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964** employers are prohibited from discriminating against individuals because of their religion (or lack of religious belief) in hiring, firing, or any other terms and conditions of employment. This federal law ensures I am not discriminated against due to my religion and religious practices.
